Brief Overview of the Wedding Policy at Holy Family

Wedding arrangements must be made at least six (6) months prior to the wedding date. Weddings are normally scheduled on Saturdays at 11:00 AM and 2:00 PM. Friday weddings are scheduled at 3:00 PM. Only two weddings will be scheduled per weekend. The reason for this is that there is so much taking place at Holy Family with our regular schedule, funerals, and other services that we need to do be respectful of the overall parish schedule.

Weddings cannot take place outside the church. Oftentimes, people will inquire about getting married at the grotto and it is not permissible. Couples are invited and encouraged to utilize the grotto for prayer and pictures.

Oftentimes, people will request a specific priest or deacon to do their wedding. The parish will do its very best to meet these requests. However, it is not always a possibility due to the fact that our priests have a busy schedule. Going forward, any weddings that do not have a Mass (ceremony only) will be celebrated by our deacon. The role of the deacon is to witness marriages and they can do that when there is only a wedding ceremony and no Mass. Priests will be assigned based on their schedule and availability. Couples should not assume that the priest they meet with initially will be the priest that does the wedding.
