Dear Friends,

On Tuesday evening (Dec. 1) we had our first joint penance service with St. Joseph's Church in Camillus. It was well attended with people from both parishes. It was a beautiful evening and I am most grateful to Fr. Peter Worn and the good people of St. Joe's for their hospitality and goodness. In Lent we will hold a joint penance service for both parishes here at Holy Family.

Some have asked why we are doing a joint service as opposed to having our own. This is a legitimate question and there are really two answers for doing the joint service. First, as priests we get numerous requests to hear confessions at penance services in Advent and Lent. By combining our resources and doing joint services, we don't have to spend every night during these two seasons at penance services. We love to hear confessions, but we do have other responsibilities and obligations. Secondly, and more importantly, I feel that we have to begin the process here at Holy Family of preparing ourselves for fewer priests. You and I know that it is a blessing to have four priests serving in our parish. We also know that it will not last forever. We will not always have four priests. In fact, given the average age of priests in our Diocese (70), it's possible that within three years we may only have one or two priests at Holy Family (I pray we will always have two priests, but we just don't know). In any event, we need to be prepared for this reality. Since my arrival in July, I have had several meetings with the pastors in our area along with lay leadership of the parishes of our area to discuss how we can work together and collaborate to ensure that the needs of our people are met with fewer priests. The priests and lay leadership of our parishes will continue to meet to discuss these matters. While I don't foresee any big changes in the immediate future, we do have to be ready for what is to come. In the meantime, I ask for your support and cooperation as we continually discern how to best serve the needs of the parish and let's pray for an increase of vocations to the priesthood and religious life (let's pray that young people from our families and our parish will hear God's call to priesthood and religious life).

Know of my prayers during this holy season of Advent!

Great News!

We have just received a letter from the Middle States Commission on Elementary and Secondary Schools that Holy Family School has been granted Middle States Accreditation. Accreditation means that:

- we have met the standards for defining appropriate educational goals and providing educational programs to achieve them
- we maintain a qualified faculty and an effective school organization
- we assess outcomes of school experiences and control the quality of educational programs
- we respond to concerns of parents and needs of the school community
- we provide for the continuity of its programs and plan for the future; and
- we describe with accuracy the content of its services and programs

Accreditation is granted by the Commission when self-study, evaluation, and planning reports reveal that the school meets the standards for accreditation and is granted for a period of seven years.
