TEACHING MASS

*Delivered at the 12:15pm Mass on Sunday, February 5th***Introductory Rites:**

We have come to the source and summit of our faith, the celebration of the Eucharist. We began our celebration with the sign of the Cross because the Cross of Christ has made the celebration of the Mass possible. The source and power of the Mass comes from the Paschal Mystery, which is the life, passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus. It is this mystery, the mystery of the life of Christ, that we recall throughout the Mass and it is this mystery that we participate in every time we gather. Jesus is truly in our midst when this celebration begins. Jesus is present in the priest, he is present in the people, he is present in the Word of God, and most especially he is present in the Eucharist. But in order to approach such a mystery, in order to approach the living and true God, we must properly prepare our hearts to enter into God's presence. Hence, the necessity to ask forgiveness for the ways in which we have failed in the past week as well as to sing with all of our hearts the Gloria, which helps us recount all the ways in which we have been blessed. Here is a fun fact: the hymn of the Gloria dates back to the early Church and is over 1700 years old! The final stage of preparation is the Collect, or the Opening Prayer, which literally "collects" or gathers all of the prayers of the people in the church into one unified prayer offered to God the Father through Jesus Christ his Son, in the power of the Holy Spirit. All prayers in the Mass are delivered to the Father through the hands of His Son, Jesus Christ, because Jesus is our sole mediator between God and human beings. We, the community, the Body of Christ, are truly praying in and through Jesus Christ at this moment.

Liturgy of the Word:

Following the Opening Prayer, we are now prepared to hear and receive the Word of God in the sacred Scriptures. Everything we hear in the Liturgy of the Word is God's Word, his message to us this week and this day. In this part of the Mass, God is truly speaking to us! If a Catholic attends Mass every day for a period of three years, that Catholic will hear and read nearly the entire Bible. The Catholic Church is committed to helping the faithful, all Catholic Christians, develop a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through the reading of the Word of God. Therefore, it is important that we personally spend time with the sacred Scriptures on our own. That being said, it is also important that we hear and receive the Word of God in the context of our faith community because it is through the teaching of the bishops in union with the Pope that we come to a true understanding of what God is saying to his people.

Liturgy of the Word (following the homily):

The word for homily in Greek is translated as "familiar speech" and is intended to break open the Word of God in familiar terms in order to foster a deeper understanding of what God may be communicating to the individual and to

the community. The community's collective and formal response to hearing and receiving the Word of God is the Creed. The Creed contains all that we believe as Catholic Christians. It is the most concise and precise catechism (or summary) of our Faith. The Creed is over 1600 years old, and many saints and Catholic faithful have given their life to promote and defend this invaluable statement of Faith. Following the Creed, we then offer our Universal Prayer, which is the particular prayer of the local community. The Universal Prayer is also considered Intercessory Prayer, which is prayer offered on behalf of another; for a person, other people, places, or situations that are in need of God's special blessings today.

Liturgy of the Eucharist:

We are now preparing to enter into the Eucharist Prayer, which is the most powerful prayer the Church can offer and it is the most important prayer we will ever pray in our lives as Catholics. Father Manno has just received the gifts of bread and wine from the faithful. These gifts offered on behalf of the community represent our entire lives: the work, blood, sweat, tears, laughter, and joy we experienced this past week. Every aspect of human life is offered up to the Father through these gifts as our sacrifice of thanksgiving. In return, the Father fills our entire life (all the work, blood, sweat, tears, laughter, and joy) with the presence of His Son Jesus. We are made holy in this celebration. We become his chosen people, his light and his salt in the world. The gifts that we offer will become the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ. During the Eucharistic Prayer, especially after the words of consecration where the priest says, "this is my Body, this is my Blood," the risen Christ, Jesus our Lord, who walked 2,000 years ago is now truly walking in our midst. This is why we show such great reverence and respect during this great prayer by remaining silent and kneeling. We are truly in the presence of the living God, the King of Heaven and Earth, and we join in prayerful song with all of the angels and saints in heaven as we cry out, "Holy, holy, holy." This is the closest we will ever be to heaven here on earth.

Concluding Rites:

We have just received Holy Communion, and are now living tabernacles, carrying the Eucharistic Christ, the risen Jesus, into the world. During the time we spend in silence after we receive, we should surrender our entire self to God's mysterious love, who chooses to dwell with us in this most powerful way. The prayer after communion that was offered by Father Manno is a prayer that our reception of the Eucharist will bear fruit in our lives with good deeds and virtue. All the grace you will ever need to become holy and make it to heaven is available to you in one single Holy Communion. You are now sent forth to preach the Gospel by the way you live your life. The Latin word for the Mass actually means to be sent forth with a mission. What is our mission? To take the Gospel of Jesus Christ everywhere we go. The Mass gives us the grace and strength to be Christ's witnesses to every corner of the world, even to the ends of the earth.
