## ANIONTING OF THE SICK PART 2

As we come upon that season, once again, of saying goodbye to loved ones as they depart this life, I would like to refocus our attention on the importance of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. As was stated in my previous article, it is a misuse of the Sacrament of Anointing to hold off until the very last moment before a loved one breathes their last. This notion that we must wait until the very last moment comes from a misunderstanding of what the Sacrament is, which can be misconstrued as a Sacrament for those who are immediately on their way out. Hence, people pick up the notion that they can **only** call a priest if someone is breathing their last. The priest then becomes akin to a grim reaper who, when called, seems to be the scary sign that death has finally arrived for that person. People seem to tremble and are even filled with fear when they see a priest walk into the room of a sick loved one.

Please do not misunderstand the priest’s presence as the bringer of death. In truth, this Sacrament is primarily to strengthen those who are undergoing great physical suffering. This Sacrament effectively unites the one who suffers with the suffering of Christ our Savior. When this Sacrament is given, the one who suffers is not left alone in their suffering, but is comforted by the presence of Christ the Lord who meets them in their suffering. The suffering of the person who receives this sacrament is not meaningless, but is filled with divine purpose as they become channels of redemption for the human race. If we wait until the very last moment before death, then the grace that this Sacrament offers to the one who suffers will be too little too late. So please call ahead of time so the grace of this Sacrament can be made available to those who need it.

One last pressing question is whether or not a priest still needs to be present at the exact moment of someone’s death. The answer, plain and simple, is no. If the person has been anointed even a couple of weeks prior, then the grace of the Sacrament of Anointing is still available to that person in force. So people may call at times full of emotion that their loved one was not anointed the moment before they died. It is always good for me in those moments to give them the happy news that I, or another priest, already anointed that person just a few days before or even a week before, and that their reception of the Sacrament was still active and effective for their loved one, even at the moment of their passing. So do not fret. Call ahead of time and inquire into whether or not it is time for you or your loved one to receive this Sacrament. Especially if anyone is at home on hospice care, please do not wait. We will be happy to visit.
