Dear Friends,

Once again, Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord - the last day of the Christmas Season. I hope this season has been a blessed one for all of you. Thank you for making it a special and holy season here at Holy Family.

Thank you for your patience and goodness regarding our new change for the distribution of Holy Communion at Holy Family. As I mentioned last weekend, the priests will not be coming out to distribute Holy Communion as was done in the past. This change helps us, as a parish family, to get ready for the reality that we will not always have four priests serving our parish. For example, this weekend Fr. Francis will be traveling home to Ghana to see his family and Fr. Jason is on vacation. So, it is just Fr. Muyo and me for the weekend and Fr. Muyo has responsibilities at the hospital on the weekend as well. Also, it gives us priests the time to be present to other things that take place on Sunday morning and Sunday afternoon at Holy Family. This change is a minor one and will take some adjusting for sure. The biggest change will be for those who sit in the Multi-purpose Room. If you are sitting in the Multi-purpose Room we invite you to come forward for communion if you are able, if you are not able, someone will come back to distribute communion - we just ask for your patience as someone will come back to that room. If there is any person at any place in the church that cannot come up to receive, I ask that you let one of our ushers know and a Eucharistic Minister will bring communion to you. Our ushers are the best at informing us as to who needs communion and making sure that everyone receives. At the 12:15 Mass you may have noticed we are only distributing 2 chalices instead of 4. The reason for this is that we don't always have enough Eucharistic Ministers. If you would like to be a Eucharistic Minister any of our Masses, let us know. As always, if you need a gluten free host, please let one of the priests know ahead of time. We know most people who need them, but not all, so please let us know. Again, thank you for your support and goodness as we go through this process.

Lastly, I speak on behalf of all of the priests in the rectory when I say thank you for all of your wonderful baked goods that were delivered to us. I can assure you that I have sampled, most, if not all, of the things that have come to our rectory and parish offices. Thank you so much for thinking of us and for your generosity and goodness at Christmas and always. As the Christmas season comes to a close, I think Msgr. Francis reminded us so beautifully in his homily for the Epiphany, "God is always with us." May we never forget this and may we continually find God's presence in our lives!

“Touching Hearts, Changing Lives”



Dear Parents,

This past Sunday’s celebration of the Epiphany, the manifestation of Christ to all, the Gospel shifts from Luke’s infancy narrative to Matthew’s. Writing for a community of mostly Jewish Christians and probably some of Gentile origin, at the beginning of his account, Matthew introduces themes he will repeat often: Jesus does not abolish Jewish Scriptures or Law, but “fulfills” them. And part of this fulfillment involves recognizing Gentiles among God’s redeemed people. Matthew assures Jewish Christians that Jesus stands in continuity with the Hebrew Scriptures and brings them to fullest development. The star guiding the Magi recalls the prophecy of Balaam: “A star shall advance from Jacob”.

While the exact identity of the Magi is unknown, Matthew tells us that they came “from the east.” In other words, they were foreigners, Gentiles—and yet they came to give homage to the Jewish Messiah. Thus, Matthew indicates that God always intended the Savior would be manifested to the Gentiles, and they would recognize him. Still another Jewish prophecy is fulfilled: “the wealth of the nations shall be brought to you.” Jesus, who fulfills the Old Testament prophecies, is made known as “newborn King,” Messiah, and Savior for all. Who might the “magi” be in your life who help you see Christ’s presence?
