PASTOR'S NOTES

Natural Family Planning

Every now and then an error comes along that is just so good, so convincing, that a lot of people buy into it. It is as if I were to take a counterfeit \$100 bill and place it next to a real \$100 bill, but for such a long time people have been convinced that the fake is good so they take the fake one instead. It's the yoke of relativism and subjectivism that has become such a great burden around our necks there are times we do not realize that the fake \$100 is counterfeit because it looks so real to us. This is a prevailing attitude I find regarding what God has revealed to us in *Humanae Vitae* and the prohibition against contraception. This also applies to sterilization for the sole purpose of contraception. God has given us an alternative with the use of Natural Family Planning (NFP).

One of the constant objections I hear to NFP is that it asks too much of people. Many will acknowledge its positive features as a form of family planning: it reverences life, it is never an abortifacient, it has no deadly side effects, and it demands only a moderate amount of abstinence. Still! – it requires self-denial and self-discipline of a kind that ordinary people will not put up with.

This objection fails to appreciate what an ordinary person can and will do given a motive and loving help. There are many instances in the Gospels where Jesus demands far greater things of people than NFP. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus is demanding yet, at the same time, pastoral and compassionate, understanding human weakness.

In light of the Gospel, ordinary people are called to greatness and made capable of greatness by grace. That greatness includes the sacrament of Marriage. Jesus tells us that Marriage is a sign of the love between Jesus crucified and the people of God. Marriage is both a grand and frightening vocation. It cannot be lived unless husbands and wives make efforts towards a love that is like that of Jesus; that is, unless they let Jesus make them begin to be great.

NFP takes the dignity of ordinary men and women seriously. It is sensitive to their needs and understands the challenges. The beauty of NFP is that it directs the human heart to the greatness that can spring up in the human spirit. In fact, it is for the sake of this goodness and greatness that God created the universe.

The Gianna Clinic is a great resource for couples who are no longer satisfied with the counterfeit \$100 bill and are willing to take this path to greatness. This weekend we welcome Karen Dalton, MD, the Director of the Gianna Clinic. As a medical doctor, she is trained to help couples on the path to greatness. Origin and Meaning of the Name:

Walter, Walther, (strong warrior) St. Walter of Pontnoise was made an abbot against his will. He fled several times to escape the position, and finally went to Rome to give his resignation directly to the pope. However, the pope asked him to return to his monastery, accept his responsibilities as abbot, and never quit again. He obeyed.

Zita, (little hope) St. Zita was sold to a family as a domestic servant, and she stayed in that position for the rest of her life. Because of her Christian beliefs, she often gave away her food, and sometimes her master's food, to those who were needier than herself. This caused problems with her employers.
