They will start clearing trees and begin the work of digging the foundation for the new building. In addition, we will be replacing all of the church doors and putting screens up in the Gathering Space and at the entrances of the church for messages, postings, and so on. I ask for your patience and support as we move through this much needed work on our campus. Again, thank you for your great goodness and generosity in allowing us to do all that we need to do to make our campus a place where people can come to know, love, and serve the Lord for years to come.

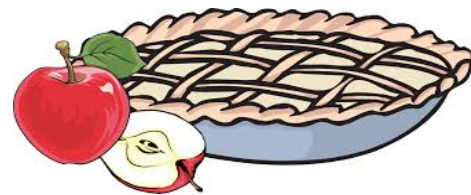
Grandparent's/Grandfriend's Day

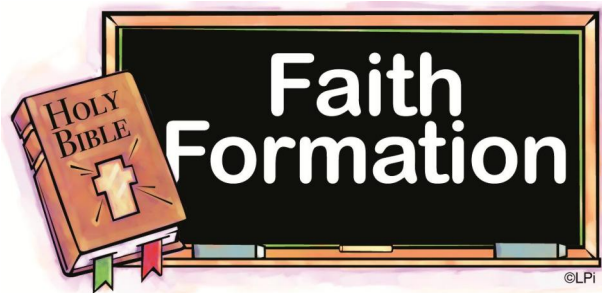
