SIX BLESSED TO BE CANONIZED October 14, 2018


- Pope Francis will canonize six Blessed on Oct. 14, 2018: Pope Paul VI, Archbishop Oscar Romero, Fr. Francesco Spinelli, Fr. Vincenzo Romano, Mother Catherine Maria Kasper and Sr. Nazaria Ignacia March Mesa. Pope Paul VI reigned from 1963 to 1978, leading the Church through the closing of the Second Vatican Council and the turbulent period that followed, overseeing significant transitions in liturgy, seminary formation, and theological study. He also launched the Synod of Bishops in 1965, as an attempt to broaden the involvement of bishops from around the world in the governance of the church. He's best known for his 1968 encyclical letter "Humanae Vitae," which reaffirmed the Church's traditional opposition to artificial birth control. He wanted a Church that was in dialogue with the modern

world. Archbishop Romero will become the first Salvadoran saint. He was murdered during Mass on March 24, 1980, a day after telling an army made up largely of peasants that they were killing their own people, shot through the heart by gunmen linked to a right-wing death squad. He was outspoken against military oppression during his country's bloody civil war in the 1980s and the role of the U.S. played in it. His death is considered by the Catholic Church to have been in "odium fidei", meaning in hatred of the faith.


