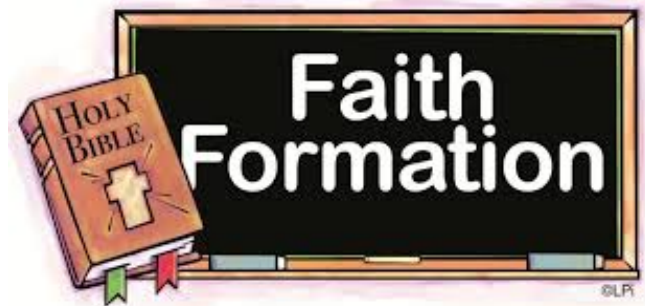

**PUTTING OUR FAITH INTO ACTION THROUGH  
SERVICE TO OUR PARISH AND OUR COMMUNITY**

We hope that you all had a holy, happy and healthy Easter. You were in our prayers as we attended Mass on Easter Sunday morning. We are always grateful and always thankful for you, our Holy Family. You support the Outreach Ministry in so many ways and we are so very blessed.

We want to take this opportunity to tell you more about what the Outreach Ministry does, and more about the people that we serve. This week I will focus on the immediate demographic areas that we serve. In the coming weeks I will be telling you about the other pantries, and agencies involved.

**We currently have 100 families who use our food pantry every month.** These families are either unemployed or under-employed. They depend on an EBT Card (formerly food stamps) and pantry assistance to put food on the table. Under the guidelines of the CNY Food Bank, we provide 15 meals as well as personal care items, paper goods and some extras (coffee, tea, mustard, ketchup, mayonnaise), when we have these items in stock. At Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter, we provide a complete holiday meal, as well as enough food for 15 additional meals. We provide fresh fruits and vegetables whenever these items are available to us.

**Here is the demographic profile, by zip code for our 100 families;**

**13219 - 60 families**  
**13031 - 26 families**  
**13209 - 5 families**  
**13215 - 8 families**  
**13164 - 1 family**

As you can see by the zip codes, the people that we serve are our neighbors. They reside in neighborhoods all around our church, and they depend on us for food assistance. We provide, nourishment, hope and even some joy to those in need. Just one way that we can show we are Christians by our love.

### **IN-PEW OPPORTUNITY PLEASE MAKE YOUR PLEDGE TODAY**

Today Father Manno will be recapping the *Our Faith-Our Family-Our Future Capital Campaign* at each Mass as well as explain how you can help if you have not already made your pledge.

On Wednesday, April 24, the campaign office reported a new pledge total of \$2,037,141 including \$503,000 which has already been received as payments on these pledges. This has been generated through the sacrificial generosity of approximately 600 families. Father Manno and the campaign committee are most grateful to our donors for their commitment and sacrifice to Holy Family and they ask that the remainder of our parish family join them in this very important project.

### **HOW MUCH SHOULD YOU PLEDGE**

*Our campaign is being conducted on the simple premise that not everyone can make the same size gift, but we can all make the same sacrifice.* While it would be ideal for each family to consider a commitment of about \$15-\$20 per week for a total pledge of \$4,000-\$5,000 we realize this may not be possible for everyone. We ask that you do the best you can and **please remember: all pledges are welcome and important.** Conversely there are some who may be able to consider a major pledge above \$5,000 and we will need participation at those levels as well.
