Dear Friends,

Winter is here! Over the past month, we have seen snow, sleet, and freezing rain. Someone told me last week that we are hearty New Yorker's and we are accustomed to this weather! Thanks be to God this is the case and we have the tools and equipment to deal with this type of weather. Even though we are well equipped and even though we are a hearty bunch in Central New York, there will be times when I will have to cancel events at Holy Family Church. I will never cancel Mass due to weather because I (the priests) live across the street and I will say Mass privately or for one person it does not matter. At the same time, I do not expect anyone to put themselves in harm's way to get to Mass. I know we all have a particular Mass we like to go to on the weekend, but if the weather is bad or if you know from the forecast it might be bad, it would be good to plan accordingly and attend an earlier or later Mass. For the weekday Masses, please use prudence when there is bad weather. While I love to have many here for daily Mass, I want you to be safe. Please use caution and care during these winter months.

In terms of canceling events here at Holy Family, I have delegated each ministry to be responsible for their own events. If you have a question as to whether or not something is canceled, please consult the person in charge of the particular ministry you are dealing with and check our local news channels (this is the most effective way to communicate a cancellation or closing). Oftentimes, we will use social media to announce cancellations. Please understand that with any cancellation here at our parish, it is not done on a whim, but with thought and consideration for people's safety. I think we can all agree that the last thing we would want to see is something bad happen due to our inability to act wisely and prudently in bad weather.

I'm a firm believer that the winter months provide us with great beauty as long as we are all safe and warm at all times!

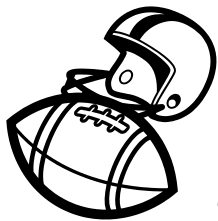


Catholic Schools Week : Save the Date
