

PASTOR'S NOTES

Dear Friends,

As I type these words, my heart is heavy as I think about the tragic shootings at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pennsylvania. Sadly, this was a crime of hate all due to a person's hatred of Judaism. My prayers have been united with the prayers of people around the world as I have been praying for the victims, their families, and all our Jewish brothers and sisters.

As I reflect on that tragic event in Pennsylvania, it forces me, as your pastor, to consider all that we are doing here for the sake of our own safety and security. This is something that I take very seriously as does our parish leadership – our parish staff, our school faculty and staff, and our Finance Council and Pastoral Council. Over the past year we have gone to great lengths to increase our security at Holy Family Church and School and I wanted to share some of the things we have done.

At Holy Family School, we have multiple cameras around the property to ensure that every angle of entry and exit into our school is covered. You will notice around our school doors and church doors there are small numbers. This helps us quickly identify where an issue could be taking place and it helps the police and fire people as well. You may have noticed on the first-floor windows and doors of the school a green and white film – some of it bearing our school logo and name. This is not done for public relations, it is done for safety. It is all security film for the sake of not allowing people the opportunity to easily see in our building and be able to identify from the outside if it is a classroom or just a room of some sort. Panic buttons have been installed throughout the school and that gives direct access to the police in case of an emergency. Access to the school is limited to the main door and everyone always must check in. This summer our faculty and staff participated in active shooter training – while it is necessary to have, we pray they never have to use it.

At the Pastoral Center we have cameras on all the outside entrances and panic buttons that would allow anyone direct access to the police in case of emergency. The doors all have a punch code access which adds extra security.

The church has security cameras at all entrances and we are in the process of installing panic buttons in the church for direct access to police in case of emergency. Soon, we will have all our outside church doors controlled in such a way that

they can all be opened and locked with the touch of a button, instead of having to go around and manually open and unlock each door. In addition, we will be installing some cameras inside the church for security purposes and looking at our outside lighting to make sure we have adequate lighting for the sake of security. We have employed the use of police officers for some of our Faith Formation nights and at our larger Christmas Masses.

As always, I am open to any thoughts and suggestions you may have. We have spent time, money, and energy on these security features and it is all worth it for the sake of our safety. I offer my sincere and heartfelt thanks to the Town of Camillus Police Department for their increased patrol. They were outside the church this past weekend and even came inside for one Mass and I let them know they are always welcome, and we are grateful for their cooperation, protection, and concern for our safety and well-being. As always, I ask you to be diligent...**IF YOU SEE SOMETHING SUSPICIOUS – SAY SOMETHING.** Please know that your safety is priority and I will do all that I can to make sure we are always all safe. Please do not be alarmed or scared by what I offer in this letter as it serves just as an opportunity for you to know that a lot has been done for the sake of safety around Holy Family. I pray that the Holy Family of Nazareth, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph watch over us and protect us always!
