MASS OF REMEMBRANCE

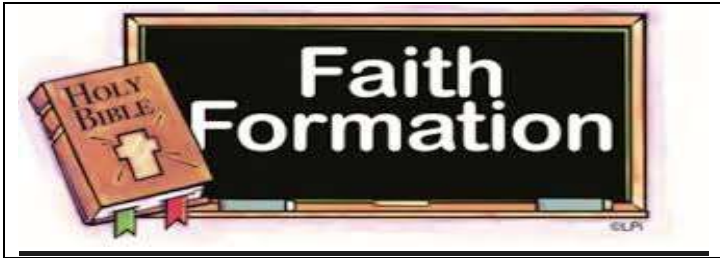
